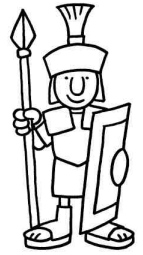


An Introduction to Latin

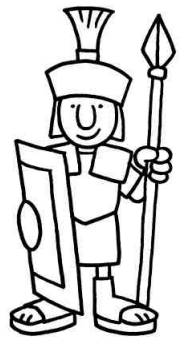
